Franklin Re-do Policy

School Board Policy EIA (Local) states a student shall be given a reasonable opportunity to redo an assignment or retake a test for which the student received a failing grade. Makeup or redo opportunities shall not be provided to the extent that the failing grade was due to the student's academic dishonesty

CIT approved procedures:

*Every student that does not make a 70 on an assignment or test has the opportunity to redo the assignment/assessment (with the exception of the final exam which cannot be redone).

*There is a limit of 1 redo per assignment/assessment. The highest grade will be a 70 (a teacher's grade is final per district policy).

*Assignments not turned in disqualifies the student from being able to redo the assignment.

*Completion of the re-do is the student's responsibility. The assignment/assessment must be done 1 week from the time the grade is posted in the gradebook/Parent and Student Portal.

*Students are to receive a zero for Academic Dishonesty and cannot redo the assignment/assessment.

*The redo assignment/test may be different from the original.
